Further to your request for information which was transferred to the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) by West Yorkshire Police on 22/02/2016 I am attaching a breakdown of income and expenditure which has been recorded in relation to services rendered to film and television productions.

Your request was for:

- 1. How much revenue has been received by your organisation for services rendered to film and television productions? This could include location rental, permits and all other services related to film productions using your personnel or resources.
- 2. Please outline the type of work or service rendered in each case and disclose the revenue received for each type of service.
- 3. How much has your organisation spent on facilitating such arrangements between 2006 to 2015 inclusive, broken down by year.

The request relates to the period between 1 January 2006 and 31 December 2015 inclusive. Please also note that I have asked for the results to be broken down by year.

I can appreciate that you may operate on a financial rather than calendar year. If this is the case and if it significantly reduces the workload then this could be changed to be the period 2005-06 to 2014-15 inclusive. The results would then be broken down by those years.

Information is disclosed to show the total recorded revenue in each financial year between 2005 and 2015 as recorded on West Yorkshire Police's systems. No information is recorded in respect of Q2 — the type of work or service rendered and the revenue received for each type of service.

In terms of expenditure on facilitating such arrangements (Q3), information is provided to show the overtime expenses in each of the years you have requested as recorded on Force systems. No other information is recorded as relating to film or television productions. In terms of chaperoning, this is only carried out by volunteer officers on Rest Days thereby having no impact on operational considerations. The full economic costs of this are included in the charge made to the production company.

In terms of the OPCC's involvement in income development the West Yorkshire for Innovation Team (WYfl) was established in April 2014, under the direction and control of the Police and Crime Commissioner, to bring together teams engaged in grant-funded security research with income development to create a unique innovation team. The WYfl team drives the Commissioner's 3i policy (income, innovation, investment) which is designed to explore new ways to raise income, encourage innovation and to invest in communities. The 3i policy ensures that the Police and Crime Commissioner explores all avenues of revenue; maximises the community benefits from assets held on behalf of the communities of West Yorkshire and explores opportunities for encouraging innovation and increasing investment in communities. Moving forward, all advertising, sponsorship and all other avenues of generating revenue in West Yorkshire Police will fall within the remit of the WYfl team.
